Acacia is #1 in ISU Greek System with 3.21 G.P.A.

The Fall, 2008 semester grade results are in, and **Acacia Fraternity** once again stands atop all of the other fraternities in the Iowa State Greek System for top academic honors. The results for the top five chapters are as follows:

It is well worth noting that our fraternity achieved the distinction of having the **highest affiliated grade point average**.

Academic excellence is a hallmark of the members of Acacia Fraternity. **As you can see from the table on this page, our chapter has been ranked #1 for ten out of the past eleven semesters!** Since the chapter was refounded in 1999, Acacia has held the #1 academic slot more than 60% of the time, and we have held either the #1 or #2 academic slot 95% of the time. An impressive record of achievement by any measure.

Our focus remains on recruiting only **exceptional men** who are **dedicated to their academic studies** and to making a **positive contribution to society**. This has been a core strategy which has been shown to be successful over the years. It is our focus on academics, personality, and a demonstrated level of leadership which has enabled us to build the preeminent academic Fraternity at Iowa State.

Based on the results for the fall semester, a total of **\$3,800** in scholarships for academic excellence was awarded to our Brothers in the active chapter. The list of the Brothers who earned a 3.00 or higher grade point is shown below, and we



This picture is taken looking to south in the dining room on the main floor of the chapter house.









The two-year planning effort that went into centennial celebration all came together and it went off perfectly. A great deal of credit for this goes to Jeremy Davis #969 and the members of the active chapter who took care of all of the details for the event so that the rest of the alumni could just sit back and enjoy themselves.

I also want to say a special thanks to the national Officers who attended the event: David J. Allen, President, Rob Roberson, Treasurer, Darold Larson, Executive Director, and Eric Wheeler, Chapter Consultant. Their attendance simply made this event more special and I want to thank them for taking time out of their busy schedules to attend the event.

I think it safe to say that everyone who attended the event had an absolutely fantastic time and enjoyed themselves thoroughly. But, if you happened to miss this event, don't think that you are not welcome to visit anytime you are in the area! The Corporate Board hosts two alumni events each year, one in the fall and one in the spring at which we host a luncheon and honor the members of the active chapter for their academic achievements. These events are free to all parents and alumni and we encourage you attend. A registration form for each event is always included with the newsletter, so don't be shy – show up and have some fun!

The Board is already looking to complete two major projects to finish our improvements to the house. The first project is tuck pointing of the brick on the exterior of the house. Brother Chip Riedmann has generously sent me a considerable amount of information on this work, and I thank him for it. The Board will be soliciting bids for this work which we plan to have accomplished this summer.

The second project is the renovation of the basement. Our plan is to "gut" the entire room, remove a closet and open up the space completely so that it is one large, multipurpose room. The room will also be completely rewired so that it is brought up to code, and set up so that the home theater sound system will function properly.

Primarily it will be used to house a "home theater" and seating area with new furniture and "pub tables" for sitting, visiting and social events. It will be designed as a relaxation area for the men of the chapter, where they go and watch television, host "movie nights" social events, or just go to visit outside of their rooms. The room can also be configured for chapter meetings, ritual work and similar events as well.

The cost of this project is \$33,000 and we are asking our alumni to help us with this project. Unfortunately, donations for this project will **NOT** be tax-deductible, but as with the windows to the house, we are convinced that this project will help us to attract new members and enhance the livability of the chapter house.
